I do want to say that I miss you all, dear friends in Christ Jesus and want to see your faces and have the blessings of personal fellowship as in the good old days...

Our daughter Alisa and I are on a scouting trip in the Republic of Georgia (old news... we are several weeks past that trip. However, the prayers are still welcomed by us), looking at places and praying for God's direction and provision for her first long term mission trip. Upon her graduation from Bible college Alisa is excited about serving the Lord and trying her skills and calling in a new environment. The studies were a huge blessing to Alisa and we thank you all who have prayed and helped in any way. So far we see multiple wonderful opportunities for work here. Would you please pray for God's confirmation and provision in this regard. Thousands of Russian speaking people of younger generation have migrated here recently. Many of them troubled and without peace are looking for answers of major life's questions. The Lord has sent missionaries here at a perfect time. Actually a youth camp in Abkhazia is still going. The second week of it that is geared towards youth. The younger kids were thoroughly blessed last week. 

And we saw around hundred or so people respond to the Gospel in one particular town. Mission work hd to take different shape depending on the situation. There were 25 of us and we had to be like Swiss knife. All parts were sharp blessed be our Lord!!

At the place where we have initially ministered intensely there is a new group of believers who look like a church of 30 people. Perhaps it is premature to say so, but it sure looks like one when we come and do home study with them. Few of our guys and gals are specifically committed to that specific work, but because we all have to return home after each trip we pray for a local chief servant to show up somehow. Please pray for all these dear souls to grow in the knowledge and grace of the Lord.

Please also pray about helping these folks in the physical needs. Those of crows are a myriad. And perhaps you already do help people in this land, but these humans that suffered are so numerous and their needs are endless. The Lord has been so good



in providing for the needs of the people we met, but I feel like I need to offer this opportunity to you, dear friends. If there is any specific good that you have during in



your heart we can try and facilitate with that desire of yours and be your hands where you can't reach from the other side of Pacific. I know I sound dramatic at times, but in this case the situation is actually beyond dramatic. In some places people live in real threat of their livelihood and their own fragile bodies being blown up in pieces any day or any hour. This picture right above where I stand with a lady.

handing her a pharmaceutical pack little town where she resides had five rockets. Folks that live there have no place to go. We had to spread thin so as to now draw attention. Locals say that in skies there can be 5-10 drones at any given time. Shortly after fly show rockets come often. Folks have no electricity, no running water, no natural age in this season of life. Also no stores and in most cases no safety. So, our visit was brief. We handed out food, meds, Bibles, prayers and had to leave as we were ordered by the folks who were in charge. The fellow that works there day after day, week after week is a hero. We can't help him get a new vehicle with the resources we have, but we hope to get him some spare wheels and few other items as he daily spends him self on these people. Please pray for this brother, his family that lives under red and noisy sky, for his few and very modest partners to be safe and to have their resources multiplied. God is Wonderful!

Please pray for unity in church and home as some of these tasks are demanding and challenging. Meanwhile life at home base does not become easier. We all pray for chiefs and kings to find peace with Jesus and one another. This part I don't doubt you do without my reminder. Also for more workers in the fields let us need praying. Please pray fro our November conference and all our beloved guests to be able to come. Please pray for Bible paining and distribution in Russia. Seems like many publishers have closed, some left. Also printing has become more expensive. Bookstores have to sell their current bathes for less than what the new orders will cost them. Please pray for David Guzik's New Testament commentaries' translation to be completed and printed. All the remaining volumes are being translated right now. Praise God

So, the Bibles and the books for home studies, or individual studies - both for ministers and the regular folks are such jewels! I won't mention that it also becomes available online free of charge to all Russian speaking folks and it is such a resource!! BTW we started facilitating the translation of this commentary into Uzbek language. That is a whole another field to reach with good solid material! Please pray for that as well. Please pray for an upgraded ministry vehicle for us. We may be able to sell this legacy van to another church who will keep it up and running fro short range ministry, but we hope to have something newer and more reliable if God will so grant to His servants. Pray we must though and I so appreciate that I have all of you, my friends.

Hopefully the winds and stores have not savaged your brain and heart, you are not politically, or worse - spiritually impaired. I imagine you all as in our last visit - sound minded, sharp, joyful, loving, full of faith, grace, good will. I pray that it is so today.
